POINTS FROM THE MISSIONARY'S PEN...

Rev. Don Patterson, cell (912) 288-7594

As many of you are aware, the Administrative Team of the Association meets monthly to evaluate the finances of the Association in light of our spending and ministry needs. I am so grateful to our great God that you as churches have shown yourselves faithful to support the work of ministry and missions of this great association through your regular contributions. You all know that the Association is fully funded by the sacrificial giving of you all as churches and that no funding comes to us from other revenue sources like the Cooperative Program. As your Associational Missionary, and on the part of the staff and team leaders, we give God the glory for your investment of missions in and through the local association. I hope you know that it is the desire of your missionary and staff, Bro. Greg and Mrs. Sarah, to be your servants as we serve our blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through the work of the Association.

Let me note that it is suggested that churches give 3-5% of their undesignated offerings to the work of the Association. Some can give more and others can give less but all can give to support missions through the Association. It is also suggested that 8-10% of the church's undesignated offerings go to supporting the Cooperative

Program. A letter was sent out by Dr. White a year or so ago noting that if a church desired to cease giving to 1 or 2 entities of the SBC through the Cooperative Program, it could do so by sending a letter to Dr. White stating that such and such entity was not to be funded by their Cooperative Program giving. The church requesting that this action be taken would then be notified that their request was received and complied with. The church requesting this action would still be considered a fully cooperating SBC church.

As you plan your budget for this upcoming year please prayerfully consider maintaining your giving status to the association and if possible increase your funding by 1% or more. You may ask, what does our giving go to support?

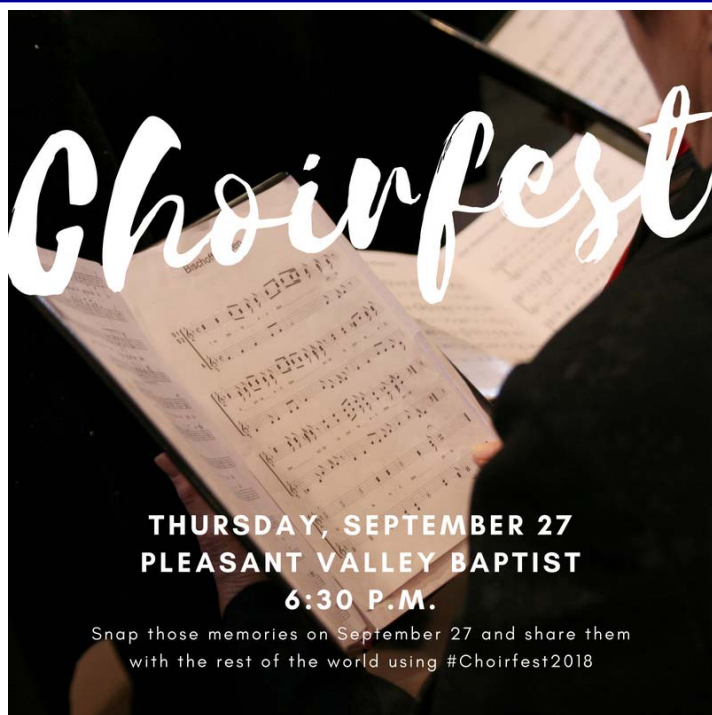

Part 5: Contact in a timely manner all first time visitors of the church.

- Sunday afternoon - Someone from the church visits Sunday morning guests. Take a gift. It can be something as simple as home made cookies or a gift card to a local restaurant. At the door say something like this. “We are from Any Baptist Church. You cared enough to visit us; we want to care enough about you to bring by this gift and to thank you for visiting with us. Is there anyway we can help you, pray for you or answer questions about the church?”
- E-mail, call or letter from the pastor. Within three days the pastor makes contact with first time visitors.
- Contact from a Sunday School Class - Within a week someone from a Sunday School Class should make contact inviting them to their class. Share information such as: the time class meets, location, and willingness to meet them outside the church to personally escort them to a class.

LETTER REGARDING COOPERATIVE PROGRAM GIVING

(Dr. J. Robert White, Georgia Baptist Mission Board)

Dear Pastor: Our Administration Committee has suggested I share with you that in recent months, a number of pastors and churches have communicated with me about their concerns over certain actions taken by SBC entities. My response to the pastors and churches included information about the provision for restricted Cooperative Program giving in our budget. I am sharing this information below so you and your congregation may also be aware should any concerns arise that lead to consideration of changes in your Cooperative Program gifts.

I have always believed in and have always encouraged unrestricted giving through the Cooperative Program because it is the best avenue of supporting the worldwide mission efforts of Georgia and Southern Baptists. However, we do have a policy that allows a church to restrict funds around certain items in our budget should they desire to do so that would also continue their support of the missionaries and mission efforts through the Cooperative Program.

Since 1998, our annual budget that is approved by our Executive Committee in September and by messengers at the November annual convention meeting has included the following provision:

Budget Directions and Procedures

.....

5. Georgia Baptist Churches may exclude up to two Cooperative Program Budget line items and still have their gifts remain "Cooperative Program" upon written notification to the Executive Director with a copy of the official church action.

MIRACLE LEAGUE OF THE OKEFENOKEE

The Miracle League of the Okefenokee is a baseball team for children and adults, ages 5 and up with mental and physical disabilities. We play ball in Waycross at the Trembling Earth Complex 2 times a year, in the Spring and in the Fall. We currently serve all counties in the Okefenokee area.

The Miracle League requires that all players have a "buddy" to stay with them throughout the game. The buddy will help the player bat the ball, run the bases, push wheelchairs and play with them in the outfield and protect their player from balls that may come their way. Most of all, they will be their FRIEND throughout the game.

Should your church make a decision to exclude up to two items in our budget as described above, our business office has procedures in place that would insure the funds are appropriately allocated around the items you ask to be excluded from your gifts and your funds would still be considered as Cooperative Program gifts.

Also, our Cooperative Program Giving and Stewardship staff (Buck Burch, John Bryan, and Scott Preissler 770-936-5296) are always ready to assist you with resources to help you and your church understand more about the Cooperative Program.

Since 1925, Georgia and Southern Baptists have joined together in response to the Great Commission to give through the Cooperative Program. This unique plan has provided the most effective and efficient way for us to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ among people in communities and cities across North America and throughout other nations who otherwise may never hear the good news of salvation through faith in Jesus. Thank you for your partnership in supporting missionaries through the Cooperative Program.

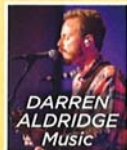
